LANDSCAPE REVIEW PROCESS

- Survey collection time frame: February 13th – April 13th, 2018
- Survey available electronically and in paper format
- Survey distributed via committee member networks, non-profit sites, and various social media outlets
- Focused on capturing a representative sample of DuPage County residents
- 1,577 responses collected (1,496 English, 81 Spanish)

LANDSCAPE REVIEW RESULTS

What are the greatest strengths of DuPage County?

- Good Schools (59%)
- Low Crime/Safe Neighborhoods (40%)
- Parks and Recreation (37%)

What are the most important health concerns?

- Drug Abuse (44%)
- Mental Health Problems (43%)
- Too Much Screen Time/Technology Use (21%)

LANDSCAPE REVIEW RESULTS

What are the top risky behaviors?

- Drug Abuse (58%)
- Alcohol Abuse (34%)
- Too Much Screen Time/Technology Use (30%)

Where should the community focus its attention?

- Access to Mental Health Treatment (33%)
- Access to Alcohol/Drug Abuse Treatment (25%)
- Good Jobs and Healthy Economy (22%)
- Affordable Housing (22%)

LOCAL SYSTEM ASSESSMENT PROCESS

- April 25, 2018 – 63 community leaders attend all-day event to evaluate the local service provider system

COMMUNITY FOOD SYSTEM INDICATORS

- Food Insecurity Rate
- Child Food Insecurity Rate

- Food Insecure Children Likely Ineligible for Assistance
- People with Low Access to Grocery Store*
- People 65+ with Low Access to a Grocery Store
- Low-Income and Low Access to a Grocery Store*
- SNAP Certified Stores

CSBG 2018 COMMUNITY NEEDS ASSESSMENT

- Survey of residents, primarily individuals with low-incomes, in Spring 2018
- Survey available at 23 health and human service agencies in DuPage County
- 2,496 responses (English and Spanish)
- Top Food and Nutrition Needs
 - Getting food from food pantries (32%)
 - Getting more food for my money (20%)
 - Learning how to shop and cook for healthy eating (17%)
